Naramatisho Women's Centre has become a centre for community empowerment across the three PWC working districts.

The Main centre is constructed with local materials, such as grass, Makuyuni hardwood, and more.

The women played a crucial role in its construction by collecting locally available materials on a voluntary basis. The centre has infrastructure that enables it to operate as a gathering place and hold many community trainings and meetings, including the launch of the ERETO.





CULTURAL CENTRE

In addition to empowering pastoralist women in our community, Naramatisho also serves as a vibrant cultural hub for tourists and visitors seeking an authentic and enriching experience.

One of the Centre's most unique offerings is our accommodation in modernized bomas, showcasing a blend of traditional design and contemporary comfort. Inspired by the traditional bomas of Loliondo, each accommodation has been carefully crafted to retain cultural authenticity while offering guests a restful and comfortable stay.

Inside, guests will find comfortable full-sized beds, thoughtfully arranged interiors, and private toilets.

Our bomas have a 360-degree window design, wrapping around the structure and allowing for abundant natural light and a continuous flow of fresh air.

SHANGA HOUSE

In addition to its many community and cultural offerings, Naramatisho is also home to a Shanga House – a vibrant space dedicated to celebrating and supporting the creativity of pastoralist women.

This shop showcases a variety of handmade pieces crafted by the women of the Centre, each piece carrying with it a story of tradition, resilience, and artistry.

Guests will find a curated selection of authentic Maasai jewelry, including beaded necklaces, earrings, and bracelets. In addition to jewelry, visitors can browse a range of locally produced items such as organic honey and healing herbs.

Every purchase made at the Shanga House goes to the women artisans who create the products, as well to Pastoral Women's Council Scholarship Program, providing pastoralist girls with access to quality education.
